It is **NOT OK** to touch other people's private parts.

It is **NOT OK** for anyone to touch your private parts.



It is **NOT OK** to look at other people's private parts (in real life or in pictures).

It is **NOT OK** to show your private parts to other people.



It is **OK** to touch your own private parts to keep them clean.



If someone else breaks a rule, **TELL** an adult you trust and keep telling until someone helps you.

If you are not sure about something, **ASK** someone to help you decide.

The Rules for Private Parts

It is **NOT OK** to take pictures of your own private parts.



It is **OK** to tell _____ if you have broken a privacy rule. They will try to help you.



It is **OK** to touch your own private parts if you are alone and behind a closed door and do not take too much time.



It is **NOT OK** to talk about private parts for fun with other kids. If you have a question about privacy or sex, please ask a grown-up.



It is **NOT OK** to make others uncomfortable with your behavior or language when it is sexual or wrong for the situation.
